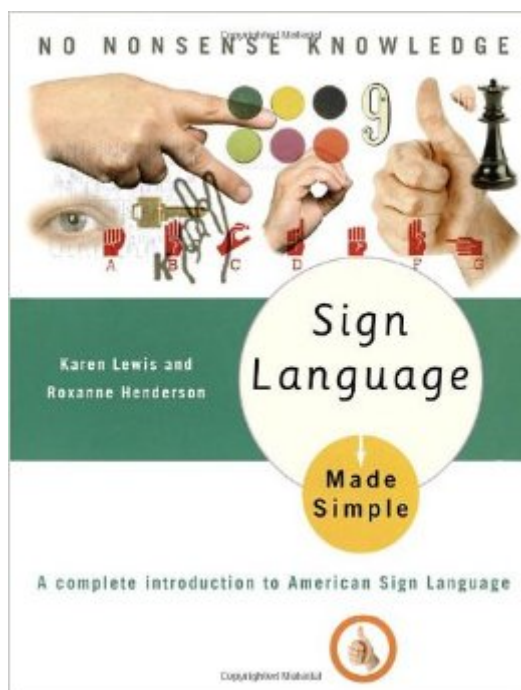

Synopsis

Part Four: Putting it all together: sentences and transitions, includes rudimentary sentences and lines from poems, bible verses, famous quotes-all illustrated. Also, grammatical aspects, word endings, tenses. Part Five: The Humor of Signing: puns, word plays and jokes. This book is great for beginners. It shows you a lot of signs that would get you started and on your way. However, our class has learned that because all of the signs are not 'universal', we needed an ASL dictionary to go along with it. The descriptions of the signing actions need to be read a couple of times in some instances to understand what you are supposed to do. But it is good for a beginner to get the basics.

My homeschool student and I are learning to sign the basics with this easy to read book. It covers letters and numbers, as well as how and where to hold your hands for the best view of the person watching. I already know some signing, so it has been easy for me to jump back in and continue. My student knew none, and is having it just as easy. The book divides words into groupings, like family, school, etc, for easier use. Great as a starter text!

I am trying to teach myself the basics of ASL and this book is pretty handy. Some of the illustrations are a little ambiguous and I have to go online to find a video to get it right. (Does that arrow mean "back and forth" or "left and right" is a good example.) I like the way the book is divided into categories of sign and it has some fun reading about ASL and its idioms that don't directly translate into English.

Signs are grouped by subject rather than alphabetical, which can lead to a lot of page flipping. There is an index, so I utilize that a lot! Helpful hints are given, signs are clear, alternative signs are given where they exist. My sign language book was 30 years old, so these signs are updated from that!

I have taken ASL classes and was using this book as a review. It's pretty comprehensive and contains substantive amounts of nouns (both concrete and abstract), verbs, adjectives, etc. The pictures and the descriptions are very helpful too.

This is a product review for Sign Language Made Simple: A Complete Introduction to American Sign Language. I bought this book because I have been trying to learn how to sign for two years now and I am always searching for a good book to help me, since I don't have anyone to practice with, after reading the reviews, I decided to give it a try and ordered it. With my Prime membership, it took three days to arrive since I ordered it late at night, it arrived in a yellow package and was left inside my mailbox. The book is like a soft-cover textbook in size and not heavy (At least for me.) I read it a bit and looked through it, just to compare it a bit with what I know and other books I have tried. The introduction was interesting, it talked a bit about the sign language history, I found the alphabet page to be good as well and love the fact that in the back, there is a few quotes and the signs to go with it. For me, this book is different from the ones I've tried before because it not only teaches signing but it also teaches a lot about the deaf culture. Included is a picture I just took of the book, I

bought mine used but it still looks fairly new. Underneath the book is the package it came in. Any questions, feel free to ask, I'll be happy to answer them as best as I can.

This book is very helpful for beginner ASL signers. It is mostly easy to understand. There were some signs that are hard to form from the description or picture given but the majority of the signs are clear and straightforward. Since trends in any language change over time, there are some alternative signs that my instructor gave for certain words. However, I would recommend this book because it is a nice and comprehensive way to ease into learning signs .

Got this book for a class. It's easy to use, includes different variations of signs that might be used. As with any sign book though, you have to try to figure out what the sign will look like in action from a drawing.

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
